"Hi Ari!" Mary was standing at the door with a big smile. She looked at Mainer and said, "Hey Mainer, do you think I..."



Here are two ways you can practice being kind.


- 1. When you have a treat, like some candy or popcorn, find someone to share it with!

Can you spot all 8 differences in these two pictures?





Can you help him collect them all?








## **Pictures from Ari's Friends**
